



CODE OF CONDUCT

RULE 1 Track Respect

- a. Everyone is responsible for keeping his/her pit area clean. The property should be left as clean or cleaner than when you arrived. There are trash and recycle bins (clearly labeled) are located throughout the facility. Please use them and empty any drinks in the sink before putting the containers please use them.
- b. These tracks are for RC cars only. NO other objects are allowed on the track.
- c. Please turn cell phones on silent during races.

RULE 2 Foul Language

No abusive or foul language will be tolerated. We wish to maintain a family atmosphere and children may be present. This includes music!

RULE 3 Alcohol, Drug, Tobacco, and Vaping

Alcohol or drug use in any form is prohibited. Anyone that is intoxicated will be required to leave immediately and forfeit their races fees. No alcohol or drugs are to be brought onto the premises. Smoking and Vaping are allowed in designated areas only.

RULE 5 RCSC Disciplines

- a. RCSC will organize all the races held and will be in control of all the activities on the premises.
- b. RCSC will allow for competition of all categories e.g. cars, trucks and buggies.
- c. It is the intent of RCSC to conduct all practices/races in a clean sportsman-like manner. Any attempts to deliberately bump or ram another car or run it off the track will be grounds for disciplinary action. Continuous disregard for other cars on the track will be assumed to be deliberate ramming. Disciplinary action can range from removal from the track to permanent ban from the track by a vote from peers.
- d. If you become upset at another driver for their actions, either tell RCSC staff, or discuss the situation off site and away from fellow racers. No heated arguments will be tolerated anywhere on RCSC property. Anyone involved in an argument will be removed from the track for the remainder of the day. A meeting with RCSC staff will be required before the involved parties can race again.

- e. Reckless driving without care for position during a race that may cause damage to the track or cars, will be disqualified from the rest of races that day. Any other un-sportsman like conduct such as doing doughnuts, throwing cars, tools, or swearing at their vehicle will result in the same penalty.

RULE 6 Driver Rules

- a. Do not switch on your radio on or drive your car in the pit area. (safety reasons)
- b. Remember motor racing is a non-contact sport. Try and avoid crashing into other cars. (repairs can be expensive)
- c. Faster drivers should remember that it is sometimes faster to driver around slower cars than having them make an unexpected move to get out of your way.
- d. If you crash, remove your finger from the throttle until the marshal has returned your car to the track. If you keep on the throttle, the marshal will not touch your car. (this is for safety reasons)
- e. Drivers must not swear at the marshals or other drivers
- f. Drivers must NOT race their cars **up and down** the straight when tuning the car...it can cause costly accidents.
- g. During race events, never drive your car without it's body.
- h. **You must marshal** the race after yours, even if you did not race. Two laps from your fastest race will be deducted if you do not marshal.
- i. **Hopping pipes** is no longer allowed. If you go over the pipe, you must wait for a marshal to return your car to the race surface. (this is to reduce damage to the track pipe)
- j. **When the track is closed**, no cars are allowed on the track under any circumstance. (announcements will be made when the track is open and closed)
- k. **ALSO, NO KIND OF RADIO CONTROL VEHICLE IS TO BE RUNNING IN FRONT OR ON THE SIDE OF THE BUILDING PARKING LOTS AT ANYTIME!!!** That Is Why We Have A Track! WE ARE SERIOUS ABOUT THIS RULE! If you break this rule, YOU will be held responsible for all damage to other vehicles or RC Sports Complex property and be asked to leave the facility.

RULE 7 Turn Marshalling

Everyone MUST turn marshal! After your heat race. If you are caught not reporting to a turn marshal position when required, a 2-lap penalty will be enforced on your best heat race or final. This could mean the difference in winning and losing. We call all turn marshals to the track as a group. We will not call individual names to report. If you are physically incapable of safely turn marshalling, LET US KNOW. The racer MUST find a suitable substitute. Therefore, you must notify us of this BEFORE the next race. How can we know???? If we need volunteers and your name is called, you must marshal or find a suitable replacement.

Marshalling Rules

- a. Go to your marshalling point immediately after your race. (only one marshal at each point).
- b. Remember to keep watching your section of the track. When going to retrieve a car, watch out for other cars and do not obstruct the vision of other drivers. Take care to put the car

back on the track facing the direction it was going before it crashed and make sure it is on its wheels.

- c. You may look for obvious problems with the car which are easy to fix, it is not your job to take the car to the driver during the race.
- d. Take care not to put the car you are marshalling in front of oncoming cars. If a driver has kept the power on and the wheels are still turning, do not touch the car until the wheels have stopped.
- e. Your friend's or child's car is not the only one on the track.
- f. You are expected to marshal even if you did not compete in your last race. Remember one day the favor could be returned and it could mean the difference between being a trophy winner or a second place.
- g. No smoking, vaping, or bringing drinks on the track. If caught doing so, you will not be allowed to race the next race.
- h. OPEN TOE shoes are not allowed on the track. (safety reasons)

RULE 8 Rules for children

- a. All kids must have an adult with them at all times. Children are not allowed to run/play on the tracks, pit area, or the rock pile at any time. We want kids to race and have fun, but they must have adult supervision and not be allowed to be unruly!
- b. All running of cars is on the track only!!
- c. Also abide by all the rules that the older racers abide by.

RULE 9 Spectator rules

Motor sports can be dangerous!

For your own safety please follow these simple rules

- Do not stand on the corners or too close to the track.
- Do not walk on to the track while racing is in progress.
- Unless you have volunteered or have been asked to marshal, please leave the cars and track alone.
- A race is not over until the computer has called race over.
